DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Ten years have passed since the recording of *Jesus Christ Superstar* made musical history and became a contemporary phenomenon. When *Superstar* first appeared, the notion of "rock opera" and of combining rock musicians with a symphony orchestra was novel, innovative and offensive to many purists. Since that time, the blending of rock with orchestral music has become one of the most exciting and promising developments of today's music.

Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice, the composer and lyricist of Jesus Christ Superstar, were surprised at the controversy, both religious and musical, that their rock opera stimulated. Now in 1980, Jesus Christ Superstar remains both a controversial and powerful dramatic work. Its creators have gone on to produce a new opera entitled Evita, which swept the TONY awards a short time ago, and is currently enjoying a successful run on Broadway.

Webber and Rice were only in their early twenties when they composed *Superstar*. It was in keeping with the youth movement of the sixties that the two writers wanted to compose an opera that stressed the "human" side of Christ as well as explore the relationship between Judas, Mary Magdalene, and Jesus. These three characters were portrayed as being caught up in a pre-ordained sequence of events that could only find fulfillment in Jesus' crucifixion, a martyrdom that would make him an instant "Superstar". For this production, we decided to stress the political aspects and the human side of the characters. Nevertheless, we still wanted to suggest the divinity of Christ, although the true make-up of Jesus' nature must be left to one's own personal beliefs.

This production is the result of work by many fine artists; and it is our collaborative vision that you see tonight. We believe that there is no definitive version of *Jesus Christ Superstar*, since the work can be interpreted in an infinite number of ways. You as audience are welcome to join in the collaboration and find for yourselves some of the mysteries inherent in *Jesus Christ Superstar*.
