BIL PFUDERER: As Supervisor of Performing Arts for the City of Austin, Mr. Pfuderer has directed the Zilker Summer Musicals for the past seven seasons. MOLLY BROWN will mark his eighth Zilker production. In Austin, he has garnered ACOT awards for numerous produc-tions including GREASE, THE BAKER'S WIFE, GOOD NEWS!, and THE MOST HAPPY FELLA. A professional director, designer, and actor, Mr. Pfuderer has worked at several major regional theatres, in both television and film, and has performed both on and Off-Broadway in productions of CAMELOT, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, and THE FANTAS-TICKS. He is presently serving on the Board of Governors of Texas Non-profit Theatres, Inc. This year Bil proudly celebrates his anniversary of thirty-five years in theatre.

JAMES IRWIN JR.: James comes to the production staff of the Zilker Summer Musical from the Performing Arts Center at the University, where he has been a production assistant for the past three years. Mr. Irwin is degreed in History and English from the University of Texas, and this fall will be accepting a position in Stage Management Internship in the San Francisco Bay area.

JUDY THOMPSON-PRICE: One of the most decorated and experienced choreographers in Austin, Judy has received seven ACOT awards for her innovative and energetic dances in GREASE, FIORELLO!, THE MOST HAPPY FELLA, HOW TO SUCCED IN BUSINESS, GOOD NEWS!, GUYS AND DOLLS, and MISS LIBERTY. Ms. Thompson, in addition to teaching classes at her own studio, the Dance Center, is head of the Dance Department at Southwestern University.

NOEL ALFORD: Mr. Alford has been the musical director of some 25 Austin productions in the last 12 years. Musicals to his credit include Center Stage's ZORBA, THE BAKER'S WIFE, and NASHVILLE ROAD, Zachary Scott Theatre Center's A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC and 110° IN THE SHADE. Noel has written scores for several local productions including A EWE-L-TIDE CAROL for the Parks and Recreation Department in 1985. Perhaps one of the busiest musicians in the city, Noel writes and directs children's musicals for Austin public schools, and performs frequently as an accompanist and soloist.

LAURA SUNKEL OLDEN: Laura is currently working as a Lighting Supervisor for the Department of Drama at U.T., where she received her Master's degree in Fine Arts in 1984. She has designed many productions in the Austin area including THE FOREIGNER at the Paramount, CURSE OF THE STARVING CLASS at Capitol City Playhouse, and THE BUTTERFINGERS ANGEL at Live Oak Theatre. She also designed the lighting for MADAME BUTTERFLY at the Performing Arts Center.

GOMEZ: Adam is a certified member of the Society of American Fight Directors, and has experience choreographing fights for many theatrical productions including THE MERCHANT OF VENICE, ROMEO AND JULIET, and THE TAMING OF THE SHREW. He has a BFA from the University of Texas with a concentration in acting. Adam teaches both workshops and private lessons in unarmed combat and swordplay. MOLLY BROWN is his second Zilker Summer Musical.

JIM FRITZLER: Jim's long list of performance/accompanist credits include associations with the Hartford Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, U.T., Austin Melodrama Theatre, and Trinity College, to name a few. A MFA in directing from the University, Jim is the Artistic Director and a founding member of Big State Productions. Mr. Fritzler is currently designing and musical directing Big State's upcoming premier THE BIG EVENT, scheduled to open this August. As a composer, Jim has scored productions of HAY FEVER, SEVEN WERE HANGED, and BORN ON A SUNDAY.

JIM WEISMAN: A graduate in Theatre from Angelo State University, Jim is presently serving as the Scene Shop Supervisor for the University of Texas Performing Arts Center. He has served for four years as the Director/Designer at the Point Theatre in Ingram, Texas. Recent Austin productions designed by Mr. Weisman include TORCH SONG TRILOGY at Austin Community College, SEASON'S GREETINGS, THE PHILADELPHIA STORY, and MORNING'S AT SEVEN for the Zachary Scott Theatre Center.

DONNA O'KLOCK: Donna has served as the exclusive hair-stylist and make-up coordinator for the Summer Musical for the past five seasons. Her coiffures have covered many different historical periods and cultures. Trained in New York, Ms. O'Klock has been cutting and styling hair in Austin for the past eight years. She has worked with almost every theatre group in Austin and has also served as hair and make-up consultant for several films. Donna is co-owner of the popular Austin salon Rafferty & O'Klock.






