



Greetings:



BIL PFUDERER: As supervisor of Performing Arts for the City of Austin, Bil has directed the Zilker Summer Musicals for the past eight seasons. CAMELOT will mark his ninth Zilker production and his debut as an actor on the Hillside Stage in the role of "Merlin." Bil has long been associated with CAMELOT, having served as an assistant to Mr. Alan Jay Lerner and director Moss Hart on the original production of the show. He later appeared on Broadway in the show and has played the role of "King Arthur" in three different national production companies. In addition to his regular city duties, Bil is presently serving as a member of the Board of Governors of Texas Non-Profit Theatres, Incorporated. A professional actor, director, and designer, he has worked at several major regional theatres, in both film and television, and has performed in both On and Off-Broadway productions.

JUDY THOMPSON-PRICE: One of the most decorated and experienced choreographers in Austin, Judy has received eight Austin Circle of Theatre awards for her innovative and energetic dances in GREASE, FIORELLO!, THE MOST HAPPY FELLA, HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS WITHOUT REALLY TRYING, GOOD NEWS!, GUYS & DOLLS, MISS LIBERTY, and THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN. In addition to teaching classes at her own studio, The Dance Center, Judy is head of the Dance Department at Southwestern University.

NOEL ALFORD: Noel has been the musical director of over 26 productions in Austin in the last 13 years. Musicals to his credit include ZORBA, THE BAKER'S WIFE, NASHVILLE ROAD, A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC, and 110° IN THE SHADE. He has written scores for several local productions including A EWEL-L-TIDE CAROL for the Parks and Recreation Department in 1985. Noel served as the music director and conductor of last year's Zilker Summer Musical THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN. Perhaps one of the busiest musicians in the city, he also writes and directs musicals for the Austin Public Schools, and performs frequently as an accompanist and soloist.

JIM WEISMAN: A graduate in Theatre from San Angelo State University, Jim is presently serving as the Scene Shop Supervisor for the University of Texas Performing Arts Center. He has served for four years as the Director/Designer at the Piont Theatre in Ingram, Texas. Recent Austin productions designed by Jim include THE SOUND OF MUSIC, LOOT, and ARSENIC AND OLD LACE at the Zachary Scott Theatre Center, and THE MERRY WIVES OF WINDSOR for the Austin Shakespeare Festival Company. Jim received the Austin Circle of Theatres award for scenic design. He also created the scenery for last year's Zilker Summer Musical presentation THE UN-SINKABLE MOLLY BROWN.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Art, especially performance art, is at best ephemeral. It exists and has meaning only for the moment it is witnessed. If successful, it communicates and creates a bond between the performer and the audience. Its lasting effects are held only by memory and retained in direct proportion to the impression made at the time of the performance.

The question "Is art necessary?" can be answered "yes" or "no", depending on one's personal life experience. In times of economic depression, art has always been labeled unnecessary if its survival depends on funds that might be used for more "practical" purposes. Some ask "Should we support the arts when we are facing poverty?" We must at times stop to recognize that there are many types of poverty.

Edwin Booth, the famous American actor, said "Grocers serve the essential belly but actors (artists) serve the soul. And that they do with all their bone and blood and being and they bring three blessed hours of illusion into this armored world of ours. As God lives, if there is balm in Gilead, it is when the curtain rises."

In these hard economic times we are facing, it is easy to say "Let us cut the arts ... for now," but history will prove that a cut 'for now' will never be replaced. In future years and for future generations that cut will leave a void - and a poverty of the soul and spirit will replace and in time overpower any other poverty we can experience.

The Zilker Summer Musical has been an Austin tradition for the past thirty years. In that time it has served both the recreational and professional training needs of this community. It is an art form easily accessible to all ethnic and economic levels of our community.

For some it is their first exposure to live performance art and for many more it is their only affordable exposure to art of any type. For over 50 years the Hillside Theatre has been home to quality entertainment and enrichment for literally hundreds of thousands of citizens on both sides of the footlights.

Each successive year has brought budget cuts to the Hillside Theatre program and now only the Summer Musical remains. It should be obvious, then, that without your enthusiastic support, the Hillside Theatre where you sit tonight to enjoy this Austin tradition will next year be remembered only as a spot where for one brief, shining moment, there was a Zilker Summer Musical.



EDMOUND FITZPATRICK

PELLINORE: Sean may be remembered by Austin audiences for his work in productions of TARA! TARA! TARA! HOLDEN HANSON




BARRY COLVIN


