PRINCIPAL BIOS

Stacey Amorous (Maria) is originally from Santa Fe. Stacey came to Austin to get her Master of Music at The University of Texas. This is her second Zilker Summer Musical. Last year in Into The Woods she appeared as Cinderella's Mother and Snow White. Stacey's other credits include Evita, The Pirates of Penzance, Marie Dindon in La Cage Aux Folles, Heartbeats and Cherubino in Le Nozze Di Figaro.

Robert A. Linhart (Tony) recently graduated with a double major in theatre and music from Southwestern University. Originally from Houston, *West Side Story* marks his Zilker Summer Musical debut. Some of his favorite roles have been Tulsa in *Gypsy*, Nicely-Nicely in *Guys & Dolls*, Judas in *Jesus Christ Superstar* and Dr. Mongicourt in *Lady From Maxims*.

Kirk Addison (Riff) This is Kirk's second year with the Zilker Summer Musical, having been bit by the bug (literally!) last year, performing the role of the baker in *Into The Woods*. Kirk has performed locally in theatre for over eight years in roles such as Danny in *Baby*, Pippin in *Pippin*, Tony in *The Boyfriend* and Dr. Seward in *Dracula*, *The Musical Nightmare*. Like Susan Lucci, Kirk has lost more nominations for performance awards than any single actor in Austin....but he's not bitter folks. Kirk's a graduate of The University of Texas as well as Circle-In-The-Square Theatre in New York City.

Martin Garcia (Bernardo) has been performing with both Comedy Sportz and the Wide World of Comedy on Austin Access for the past three years. In addition to these improvisation troupes, Martin performs with the Cheese Pistols at the Velveeta Room. He is a member of Tapestry Dance Company having performed with them at the Paramount and Zilker Park this past spring.

Diana Wheeler Legett (Anita) Diana is a native Austinite, choreographer and photographer. Diana has performed solo in New York and was a member of the Continental Dance Company. She is currently co-owner of Totem Designs (wearable art). Diana's roles have included Derma in *La Cage Aux Folles* at Capitol City Playhouse and Ginger in *The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas* at Live Oak Theatre. She thanks her sweet husband for his patience throughout *West Side Story* — she loves you.

Douglas Taylor (Lt. Schrank) has made a career of playing the bad guy: a Nazi in Bent, a Mafioso in Street Theatre, a sexist pig in A Flea In Her Ear and a psychopathic killer in Gas Light. Douglas also played lighter roles, like Lady Enid, et al in The Mystery Of Irma Vep, Lord Brockhurst in The Boyfriend, Bobby in Run For Your Life and Ali Hakim in Oklahoma.

Robert J. Lawrence (Officer Krupke) has performed in four previous Zilker Summer Musicals. He has performed in and around Austin in numerous roles such as Dracula in *Dracula*, Judas in *Godspell*, Fagin in *Oliver*, The Duke in *Big River* and Jesus in *Disciples*. Robert has also appeared in local commercials and films including *Song of Leaves*, a film that played at the 1990 Cannes Film Festival.

Richard Craig (Doc) has been acting for almost 20 years. He has acted in Texas, California, Utah and Colorado. This will mark Richard's third appearance in a Zilker Summer Musical, the last one being 1776. Most recently he appeared as Monsieur Loyal in Tartuffe at Zachary Scott Theate Center as well as Sidney in Street Theatre and Gooper in Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, both at Capitol City Playhouse. Last year Richard received an ACOT nomination as best actor in a musical for La Cage Aux Folles.

Evan J. Kelley (Glad Hands) is a graduate of St. Edward's University with a BA in theatrical directing. *West Side Story* is his first Zilker Summer Musical. Most recently he appeared in *Evita* at Capitol City Playhouse. His next project is the musical folk tale, *Tales Of Peer Gynt*, with the Central Texas Children's Theatre at Live Oak Theatre.





JET BLOS

Sue Blankenburg (Lucille) was one half of the wacky, wicked step-sister duo in last year's Zilker Summer Musical, *Into The Woods*. Sue has been seen as the perky gunmoll, Bonnie, in *Anything Goes* and in a variety of industrial shows, musical reviews and show choirs highlighted by performances at the World's Fair in Knoxville. Since migrating south from the Midwest, Sue's heart belongs to the hillside; she is making her sixth Zilker Summer Musical appearance in *West Side Story*. Sue received the outstanding female ensemble member award in *Carnival* and danced the bird and unicorn duet in *Carnelot*. Sue has also enjoyed behind-the-scenes roles as director, choreographer, lighting designer and writer in other productions. Sue appears tonight with heart-felt gratitude to her husband and family and in special memory of her mother, a long-time fan and supporter of the Zilker Summer Musical.

Karyn Brock (Michelle) from Paris, Texas, is pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in mathematics at The University of Texas, where she also studies dance. This is her first Zilker Summer Musical performance. Karyn hopes to continue her involvement in theater arts.

Kirk Burg (Diesel) has performed in Evita, Loose Ends, Eastern Standard, The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas, Amahl And The Night Visitors, Picnic On The Battlefield, A Christmas Carol and Patience, in and outside of Austin. When not on stage, Kirk can be seen in front of the TV eating moon pies.

Barry Colvin (Action) returns to the Zilker stage after appearing in *Camelot* several years ago. In Austin, he has performed in productions of *The Sound Of Music, Godspell* and received B. Iden Payne nominations as best actor in a musical for his performances in *Pippin* and *Celebration*. Barry came to Austin to pursue a career in communications. Before that he performed in summerstock productions of *The Lone Star* and *Hello Dolly!* in Galveston. Other credits include *The Pirates of Penzance, The Lion In Winter* and Tenessee Williams' *The Two Character Play*.

Chris Compton (Snowboy) makes his summer musical debut with *West Side Story*. Having lived in Austin for nine years, Chris is a self-employed competition ballroom dancer and teacher. Several of Chris' students currently hold numerous regional and national ballroom titles. Chris is a member of the Capital City Men's Chorus.

L. Scott Donald (Baby John) holds a Master of Music in piano performance from The University of Texas at Austin. He dances with Austin Contemporary Ballet and has been a guest artist with Texas Youth Ballet. His musical theatre credits include *La Cage Aux Folles*, *The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas* and most recently he appeared with Joe York in *No One Is Alone*, a musical review at Hyde Park Theatre. During the day, Scott is the undergraduate coordinator in the Department of Music at The University of Texas.

Kara Bliss Galbraith (Graziella) appeared most recently in Live Oak Theatre's House of Blue Leaves as Corrina Stroller, following other roles such as Angel in The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, Mabel in Pirates Of Penzance and Shelby in Steel Magnolias. By day, Kara is a graduate student at The University of Texas working on a Master's in international communications and holds degrees in journalism and English literature. This is her first Zilker Summer Musical.

Mark A. Fisher (Arab) This is Mark's first theatre performance in Austin. He graduated with a degree in theatre from Central Michigan University. For the last three years he has been a company member of the Austin Contemporary Ballet and also serves as their production manager. Mark is the color guard instructor at Bowie High School and has never been happier.
