

A total audience of over 50,000 people, ranging in age from infant to grandparent, come to this event each year to enjoy high-quality, free-to-the-public outdoor theatre. While this tradition was once supported wholly by the City of Austin, the musical is now produced solely with funding raised from the Friends of the Summer Musical (FOSM), a non-profit 501(c)(3) community organization. We are especially grateful to Austin CableVision, whose generous support in varying capacities has made this year's musical possible. A portion of their gift has also allowed FOSM to begin an endowment fund to ensure that the summer musical will continue for many years.

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MS. Galbraith recently appeared in BEEHIVE CHRISTMAS PARTY. She has also appeared as Audrey in LITTLE SHOP OF HORRORS a role which won her the ACOT Award for Best Actress in a Musical. Her other roles include Mabel in PIRATES OF PENZANCE, Angel in THE BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS, Corinna in HOUSE OF BLUE LEAVES and Shelby in STEEL MAGNOLIAS. Kara holds degrees in English and Communications; she is fluent in Russian and also plays the violin.

MICHAEL HARLAN (Mrs. Eggelston, Jr. Pinchley, The General, The Assistant Director and Yulnick) Long a favorite of Austin audiences, Michael is making his Hillside Theatre debut. He teaches at McNeil High School where he has directed THREE SISTERS, THE CRUCIBLE, and A LIE OF THE MIND. His directing credits include productions at Capitol City Playhouse, St.Edwards' University, and The University of Tennessee. His productions of SOMETHING'S AFOOT and CLOUD NINE both won ACOT Awards for Best Production and Director. His many acting roles include Albin in LA CAGE AUX FOLLES, de Sade in MARAT/SADE, Evans in TERRA NOVA, and Goat in THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM for which he won an ACOT AWARD as best Featured Actor in a Musical.

MARY PAT HELTON (Mama, Miss Keppel-white) A veteran Summer Musical performer "Mary Pat" has appeared in six Hillside musicals including FIORELLO! and HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS. Most recently, she played Red Riding Hood's Granny and the voice of the Giant in INTO THE WOODS. An active Board Member of Friends of the Summer Musical, she is presently pursuing a degree in Theatre Arts and Music at St. Edward's University. Her other theatre roles include CINDERELLA, GYPSY, and THE THREE PENNY OPERA.

CHARLES HUCKABY (Noble Eggelston, Amos Pinchley, Val du Val, Fred Poitrine, Otto Schnitzler, Crown Prince Cherny, Noble Jr.) "Huck" lists roles in DAMN YANKEES, THE MUSIC MAN, THE FOREIGNER, NOISES OFF, THE FANTASTICKS, SLY FOX, and BARE- FOOT IN THE PARK all before his arrival in Austin. Austin audiences will remember him in THE BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS, THE CRUCIBLE, EVITA, A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC, THE BISHOP, and OKLAHOMA! LITTLE ME will be his second Summer Musical and hopefully not his last, providing he can survive the challenge of this seven character role created in the originally on Broadway by Sid Caesar.

JACKI ROACH (Belle Poitrine) Ms. Roach is appearing in her third Summer Musical. Last season she delighted audiences with her portrayal of Ado Annie Carnes in OKLAHOMA! and in 1991 played Florinda in INTO THE WOODS. Jacki has also appeared in DAMN YANKEES, CAROUSEL, and SIX WOMEN WITH BRAIN DEATH at Zachary Scott Theatre, NINE and THE WONDER YEARS at Live Oak and further distinguished herself with memorable performances in THE BAD SEED and IS THERE LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL?

SCOTT SCHROEDER (Benny Buchsbaum) 1994 will mark Scott's twelfth season with the Summer Musical. He has been enjoyed in Hill-side productions of CAMELOT, INTO THE WOODS, THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN and GOOD NEWS. He was one of the founding board members of The Friends of the Summer Musical. Scott has been seen in other productions of MAN OF LA MANCHA, THE MUSIC MAN, BIG RIVER, and SWEENEY TODD. Scott is also the Artistic Director for BROADWAY AUSTIN, having presented productions of NUNSENSE and LITTLE SHOP OF HORRORS. He received an ACOT nomination for his work as Master Jacques in Deus Ex Machina's production of THE MISER.

MARTIN VASQUEZ (Bernie Buchsbaum) Mr. Vasquez, currently a voice student of Joseph Evans, was recently seen as Homer in the new Austin musical, THE ELECTRIC STREET at Chicago House. A former High School choral director with a degree in music from UT, Martin has appeared as Pirelli in SWEENEY TODD, Nanki Poo, in THE MIKADO, and Goro in MADAME BUTTERFLY. Appearing in his first Summer Musical, Martin aspires to a career in Opera and Musical Theatre.

BLAKE YELAVICH (Patrick Dennis) Blake is making his Hillside Theatre debut in the role patterned after the actual author of LITTLE ME. Blake has played principal roles in DEATHTRAP, BEYOND THERAPY and MURDER AMONG FRIENDS. He is the author of KINGS, BROTHERS HEART, and BUCKS DISCIPLE as well as NEW YORK CITY OVERTURES which received nominations for Best Musical by the Austin Critics Roundtable. Austin theatre goers will remember him as Perchik in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and recently as Whizzer in FALSETTOS, a role which won him a nomination as Best Featured Actor by Austin Theatre Critics.

TIM BLACKWOOD (Ensemble) Mr. Blackwood originally attended Purdue University and hails from Indiana. This is Tim's 2nd summer musical appearance after playing the Wolf and Cinderella's Prince in INTO THE WOODS. Tim's theatre credits include MY NEIGHBOR, DR. JEKYL AND MR. HYDE, and BEAUTY AND THE BEAST with Second Youth, as well as other productions of A CHRISTMAS CAROL, DRACULA: A MUSICAL NIGHTMARE and PIRATES OF PENZANCE. You may also recognize Tim from his modeling or his role as the "loveable" drug dealing pilot on America's Most Wanted.

CHRIS COMPTON (Ensemble) Chris began his musical theatre experience with the Zilker Summer Musical, WEST SIDE STORY. Since then, Chris has enjoyed working in other theatre productions such as LITTLE SHOP OF HORRORS at Hyde Park Theatre produced by Broadway Austin, DANCING AT LUGHRASA at Live Oak Theatre and SWEENEY TODD at Capitol City Playhouse, for which he received a Critics Choice award nomination. Chris earns a living as a ball-room dance teacher and holds memberships in many ballroom organizations. Chris is also a member of the Board of Directors for Friends of the Sumer Musical.

CHRISTINA DAHLBERG (Ensemble) Ms. Dahlberg is an Austin native with vast performance experience. Christina has performed no less than 12 Zilker Summer Musicals including, PIPPIN, MOST HAPPY FELLA, HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS WITHOUT REALLY TRYING, GOOD NEWS!, GUYS AND DOLLS, MISS LIBERTY, MOLLY BROWN, CAMELOT, CARNIVAL, ANNIE and OKLAHOMA!. Other theatre credits include ANYTHING GOES at Live Oak Theatre and NUNSENSE a Broadway Austin production at Zachary Scott Theatre. Christina is currently employed with Impact Printhead Services.

SHELBY SCOTT DAVENPORT (Ensemble) Shelby is originally from Iraan, Texas. This marks his debut on the Zilker Musical stage. His past theatre credits include JULIUS CAESAR, BEAUTY AND THE BEAST, CRIMES OF THE HEART, THE MUSIC MAN, ALL MY SONS, LI'L ABNER, COME BACK LITTLE SHEBA AND ANDROCLES AND THE LION. Shelby is currently pursuing a B.F.A. in Acting from the University of Texas at Austin.

VLADISLAV GLOUCHKOV (Ensemble) Mr. Glouchkov trained for 10 years in Vorkuta, Russia, in the Komi Republic under the direction of choreographer Nadejda Tcharikova. Their awardwinning dance collective won numerous first-place awards and was invited to perform on Russian television, for a United Nations youth festival, and

for Boris Yeltsin's inauguration. This marks Vlad's debut as a Zilker Summer Musical performer. He has performed for the last two summers as a member of the Russian dance ensemble Synega. Vlad currently performs with the Austin Contemporary Ballet.

TYLER A. JONES (Ensemble) Tyler is presently a junior at Anderson High School, where he is a member of the drama club and choir. Tyler's most recent role was as Baptista in TAMING OF THE SHREW, Anderson High School's entry in the UIL one act play competition. This is Tyler's debut on the Zilker Summer Musical stage with other theatre credits of GUYS AND DOLLS and A CHRISTMAS CAROL. Tyler aspires to a career in theatre.

AUBREY VALE LINDQUIST (Ensemble) Ms. Lindquist returns for her 3rd performance in a Zilker Summer Musical. She previously appeared in OKLAHOMA! and WEST SIDE STORY. Her theatre credits include GODSPELL, ONCE UPON A MATRESS, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and PIPPIN. Aubrey attended Indiana University and received degrees in Bioanthropology and Psycology. While there she directed and choreographed, YOU'RE A GOOD MAN CHARLIE BROWN.

BONNIE A. MARSTON (Ensemble) Bonnie is making her debut in the Zilker Summer Musical. Last summer, she performed as Sister Hubert in NUNSENSE with the Wimberley Players. At Southwest Texas State University, she performed in BRIGADOON, PIRATES OF PENZANCE, THE MUSIC MAN and MAN OF LA MANCHA. She also has performed in opera scenes including FIORDILIGI, COSI FAN TUTTE, Adele in DIE FLEDERMAUS, Helen in HIN AND ZURICK and Mercedes in CARMEN. Bonnie is presently starting Graduate School in Vocal Performance at UT while teaching voice privately.

KIM TRAEGER NUTTER (Ensemble) Ms. Nutter is returning for her 3rd season with the Zilker Summer Musical. Her previous summer musical performances include WEST SIDE STORY and OKLAHOMA!. Kim's other theatre experience includes MAME, SHOWBOAT and THE SOUND OF MUSIC. In addition to theatre, Kim has performed with numerous ballet companies including Austin's own Austin Contemporary Ballet.

KAREN OLSON (Ensemble) Karen background includes 11 years of ballet and jazz with 10 years of tap. This is Karen's debut Zilker Summer Musical performance. She is currently a junior at Lago Vista High School where she finds time to play oboe in the band, serve as a Student Council Representative and work as the Vice President of the junior class.





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
