

Kirk Addison (Benny Southstreet)


After a three-year hiatus, Kirk returns to the Zilker Summer Musical this year for his fifth show. Past roles include: the Baker in Into the Woods, Riff in West Side Story (for which he received The Austin Circle of Theatre's "Best Actor" award); Wil Parker in Oklahoma! (for which he received ACOT's "Best Supporting Actor" award); and George in Little Me. Around town, Kirk has performed in just about every theatre, playing roles such as Buck in Buck's Disciple, the Dentist in Little Shop of Horrors, Danny in Baby, and Mercedes in La Cage Aux Folles.

Lowell Bartholomee (Big Jule)

Lowell began acting in his native Baltimore, performing in such productions as Antigone and The Elephant Man. Since moving to Austin, he has played Poole in Second Youth's Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde and Banquo in Rare Creation's Macbeth. Lowell has even tried his hand at directing Different Stage's production of Alan Ayckbourne's Drinking Companion.

Brian Sean Gaston (Rusty Charlie)

This year, Brian celebrates a milestone 20 years in theatre. Beginning at age 13 in his hometown of Miami, Florida, he has more than 40 roles to his credit, including Al Peterson in Bye Bye Birdie, Scrooge in A Christmas Carol, Darling in Strider, and Enkidu in Gilgamesh. Locally he has played Magaldi in Evita; Rooster in Bremen Town Musicians, Beast in Beauty and the Beast, and Jigger in Carousel. This is his third season on the Zilker Hillside.



Kirk is making his Zilker Summer Musical debut with Guys and Dolls. Patrons of Capital City Playhouse might recall its production of his original play, Figment, as part of the Texas Young Playwrights' Festival in 1994.

Joe Hamilton (Nicely-Nicely Johnson)

Back in Texas after a five-year absence, Joe is making his first appearance in a Zilker Summer Musical. During the last several years, he has appeared in musical productions of On the Town. Assassins, and Animal Crackers. His favorite role was Stevie Moore, a misunderstood small-time crook in the black comedy Escape From Happiness. Additionally, Joe has had the opportunity to travel the United States with the national tour of Babes in Toyland.

Jesson Hunt (Harry The Horse)

Jesson has appeared in four shows at The University of Texas: Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead, Mythosystole, Branson or Bust, and Festival of One Acts. You may also recognize Jesson from his role as Mikey in Zachary Scott's long-running Shear Madness. He is very excited to be playing tough guy Harry The Horse in Guys and Dolls because according to Jesson, he's tired of portraying "nerds and geeks."

Tyler Jones (Twelve-Gun Tweenie)

Back for his third season with the Zilker Summer Musical, Tyler's previous Hillside performances include last summer's *Once Upon A Mattress* and 1994's *Little Me.* Other favorite roles include Julian Marsh in *42nd Street* and Noah in *The Rainmaker.* Tyler just completed his freshman year at Sam Houston State University where he played Henderson in *You Can't Take It With You*, Tobias in *Sweeney Todd*. He was also honored as one of Sam's Top Ten Outstanding Actors.

Alex Lorenz (Brandy Bottle Bates)

Alex returns to the Hillside Theatre after appearing in Once Upon A Mattress last year. Originally from Dallas, he has appeared in Assassins, Pump Boys and Dinettes, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Best Li'l Whorehouse in Texas, Carousel, Camelot; and The Diary of Adam and Eve, in such venues as Theatre 3, Pocket Sandwich Theatre, Denton Community, Northlake and Mountain View colleges.

Ronald Macklin (Louie the Lug)

This is Ronald's debut with the Zilker Summer Musical. Ronald has been in three other musicals in Austin, including: **Ducktails and Bobbysox**, **The Music Man**, and **Memorial**. He has an associates degree in Theatre from ACC and is finishing his degree in Theatre at SWTSU. Ronnie's future plans are to finish his education then move to San Diego to join the film and theatre scene.

Robert Muraida (Angie The Ox)

Robert returns for his second year on the Hillside after having played Durham in last year's *Once Upon A Mattress*. When he's not playing Angie, he is busy working with Fourth Wall Theatre Company—a group he helped found in 1995—reviving its production of *Dates Without Chicks*. He has appeared as Eddie in *The Rocky Horror Show;* King Herod in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and Officer Descamisado in *Evita*.

Mike Ooi (The Greek)

This is Mike's first appearance in a Zilker Summer Musical. At Southwestern University in Georgetown, where he is a senior, Mike has performed as Ali Hakim in *Oklahoma!*, Everett in *Crazy For You*, and Samuel in *Pirates of Penzance*. Mike will head to New York City this fall for an internship with Gotham City Improv.

Blake Osner (Society Max)

Blake is happy to be back this summer after his first appearance with the Zilker Summer Musical last year in *Once Upon A Mattress*. Other Austin productions in which Blake has appeared include: *Sweeney Todd* at Live Oak Theatre, *In the Spotlight* with Broadway Austin, and *Evita* at Capital City Playhouse.



Mark is a native Austinite and Zilker Summer Musical veteran, having performed in *Camelot; Carnival; Annie;* and last summer's *Once Upon A Mattress.* Other credits include Zach Scott's *The King and I; A Christmas Carol;* and *Carousel;* Second Youth's *Snow Queen;* and University Presbyterian Church's production of *Celebration.* Mark is currently a member of *River City Pops* and former member of The University of Texas *Children's Chorus* and *Summer Pizzazz.*



An Austin resident for 34 years and an attendee of past Summer Musicals, John Steven has always wanted to perform on the Hillside and makes his debut performance in *Guys and Dolls*. John's credits vary from local television appearances, singing, dancing and playing the violin to dancing nationally on *American Bandstand*. He has taught dance at local community schools and sings with the *Capital City Men's Chorus*.

Mark Rosholt (Liver Lips Louie)

Mark's performance credits largely consist of classical vocal work. He has performed in several musical productions including *Pirates of Penzance; Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat;* and *Gypsy*. This is Mark's first Zilker Summer Musical.



Guys and Dolls is not only Donald's first Zilker Summer Musical, it's his first musical ever. He last appeared in Salvage Vanguard's production of *The Ravaging* at the Planet Theatre. Other stage credits include *Petra's Pecado; Sin; Etta Jenks; Storyland; Nikki and Bobby; The Tempest; Holy Ghosts; Close Ties; Beyond the Horizon; and Edmond.*

Dan Sullivan (Sky Masterson)

This is Dan's second appearance on the Hillside, having played Pharaoh in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. Other Austin credits include Shear Madness; Das Barbecue; and Avenue X at Zachary Scott Theatre; The Christmas Schooner at Austin Theatre for Youth; and Sweeney Todd at Live Oak. Regionally, he has appeared in Romance/Romance; Brigadoon; Assassins; and Merrily We Roll Along.

Douglas Taylor (Lieutenant Brannigan)

Mr. Taylor was last seen in ATY's production of *The Hardy Boys in the Mystery of the Haunted House*. Additionally, Douglas appeared in *Julius Ceasar*; *Lusffia*; *Inherit the Wind* and *Black Coffee*. His New York credits include *Taming of the Shrew* with Shakespeare in the Park-ing Lot and Eugene O'Neil's *Snipper*. Film and television appearances include *Dazed and Confused*; *Bed of Lies*; *Suburbia*; *Heartbreak Hotel*; and *The Newton Boys*; opening next spring. This is Mr. Taylor's second summer musical and he is happy to return with many old and new friends

T. Michael Word (One-Eyed Johnny)

Michael performed in his first show 12 years ago—Zilker's 1985 Guys and Dolls. Since then, he has been a featured dancer in many productions, including six other Zilker Musicals. His favorite shows include Camelot; West Side Story; Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat; Best Li'l Whorehouse in Texas; and Pirates of Penzance. Michael has performed with Austin Contemporary Ballet and many regional ballet companies.

Dolls

Esperanza Biehle (Maria Consuela)

This is Esperanza's first Zilker Summer Musical but her second appearance in *Guys and Dolls*. She played a Hot Box Girl and the solo Cuban dancer in IBM's production earlier this year. Esperanza choreographs for various schools and drill teams and was a finalist in the National Search for the Disney Dancers.

Sue Blankenburg (Trixie O'Toole)

Sue is a Summer Musical veteran, debuting in 1986's *Miss Liberty* and marking her ninth appearance with *Guys and Dolls*. Sue has been voted "Most Valuable Female Ensemble Member" in Hillside productions of *Carnival*; and *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*. Frequent Zilker Musical fans may remember Sue as a featured dancer in *The Unsinkable Molly Brown*; *Camelot; West Side Story*; and *Oklahoma!*; or as Cinderella's wicked stepsister, Lucinda, in *Into the Woods*.

Kara Bliss (Miss Adelaide)

A 10-year veteran of Austin theatre, Kara returns for her fourth Zilker Summer Musical. Hillside roles include Lady Larken in Once Upon A Mattress and Belle Poitrine in Little Me. Other favorite roles include Lulu in The Birthday Party; Mable in Pirates of Penzance; Mrs. Elvstead in Hedda Gabler; Shelby in Steel Magnolias; and Audrey in Little Shop of Horrors, a role which earned her Austin Circle of Theatre's Best Lead Actress in a Musical award. Kara is a violinist with degrees in English Literature and Communications.

Cheryl Boyd (Violette Shumberger)

Cheryl was previously seen in Zilker's Once Upon A Mattress, making this her second summer musical. Other theatre credits include Man of La Mancha; Oklahoma!; Peter and the Wolf; The Wiz; Archy and Mehitable; A Midsummer Night's Dream; and Sweet Charity. In addition, Cheryl has performed in several original musicals produced by Second Youth including Beauty and the Beast; Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde; Bremen Town Musicians; and Steadfast Tin Soldier.

Dana Campbell (General Cartwright)

Dana is making her Zilker debut. Known to burst into song at any opportunity, Ms. Campbell has been featured in productions of Where's Charley; Arsenic and Old Lace; Kiss Me Kate; Oklahoma!; and Our Town. Dana has performed with choral groups since age 10, and toured nationally with The University of Chicago Motet Choir. She performs as a soloist and is a cantor for the Diocese of Austin.



Other performances throughout her home state of Oklahoma include roles of Lola in *Damn Yankees*; Magnolia in *Show Boat*; and Laurie in *Oklahoma!*. Jennifer was last seen only two months ago performing in another Austin production of *Guys and Dolls*. She claims she just can't get enough of this show.

Susan Crabb (Priscilla)

Susan is proud to make this role in *Guys and Dolls* her debut acting performance. No stranger to the theatre, she has been a fan of the Zilker Summer Musical since she began studying English at The University of Texas at Austin in 1992. Additionally, she has been a backstage substitute during Zachary Scott Theatre's production of *Ruthless!*

Christina Dahlberg (Fidellita)

If there's a true veteran of the Zilker Summer Musical it has to be Christina who performs here in her 14th Hillside production. Past performance credits include last year's *Once Upon A Mattress; Camelot; Carnival; Good News!; Miss Liberty; Annie;* and many others. Among her favorite roles are Sister Mary Amnesia in *Nunsense;* and Her in *Gifts of the Magi.* Christina is vying for a reserved parking space in the park if and when she reaches 15 shows.



This is Amy's first performance in Austin, however, she comes to the Hillside Theatre with many-a-production under her belt. In McLennan, where Amy attended school, she performed in *My Fair Lady; Mother Courage; Teahouse of the August Moon; Dance Machine and Dance Works;* among others. Additionally, she spent a summer at the Texas Shakespeare Festival where she played The Kid in *The High Falutin' Adventures of Armadillo Al and the Kilgore Kid*.

Lisa H. Keating (Agatha)

Having recently wed and relocated to Austin from her native state of Vermont, this is Lisa's first local performance. 
