

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
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The Deacon Crain Award

The improvements were done with funds and resources that were only available for capital improvement and could not be used for production costs. Many of the improvements have resulted in savings for certain production costs.

This Hillside Theatre has received roughly \$25,000 in design work and \$25,000 towards other projects in the past year.

DESIGN PROJECT

Mac Ragsdale with Architecture Plus assembled a design team in coordination with Zilker Theatre Productions and City of Austin Parks Dept to develop a master plan for the Zilker Hillside Theater. It includes extended backstage and loading dock space, air conditioned storage, a green room, rehearsal space for small groups, bathrooms with showers and a canopy covering the entire back lot. The design team includes John Faulk volunteer coordinator, Datum Engineering Inc, Encotech Engineering Consultants


Inc, Murfee Engineering, Flintco Constructive Solutions and PSI Geotechnical Services.



AC PROJECT

With the donation of the roof work by Wilson Roofing, discounts on installation and a generous donation to the production by Christianson Air Conditioning and Plumbing, a generous discount by American

Standard on the equipment, quality electrical work by Richard Faulk with Harry Swimme Electrical Specialist, and grant money from the Lola Wright Foundation, the city acquired 2 AC systems valued at nearly \$10,000 for under \$5000.



Both dressing rooms were given a face lift which included a paint job, new cove base and carpeting, electrical repairs, carpentry work that included new storage rooms, a new sound room and dressing table repair. A special thanks to Carpet Stop and Tiburcio Garcia, for discounting the flooring and installation substantially. Thanks to

the fine staff of the HAND Dept of the city.





ELECTRICAL PROJECT

We are grateful to Richard Faulk with Harry Swimme Electrical Specialist who improved or repaired the electrical systems. A lot of time was donated and much was paid for by The HAND division of the Parks Dept and grant money. As well as new additions, the existing electrical system enjoyed quite a face lift.

WATERLINE AND FOUNTAIN PROJECTS

We are grateful for installation of a water line to the Hillside Theater by the parks department. This is the first time we have had drink-

ing water available backstage. We are grateful for Sully's Plumbing donating a portion of the plumbing work. There are now 2 water fountains (ADA Accessable) with chilled water back stage. In addition there are 2 hose bibs back stage. Funding was provided by the Austin Parks Foundation. A special thanks to Micheal Reichert with Home Depot for providing the deck construction at no charge. This allowed the project to go forward with the money available.
