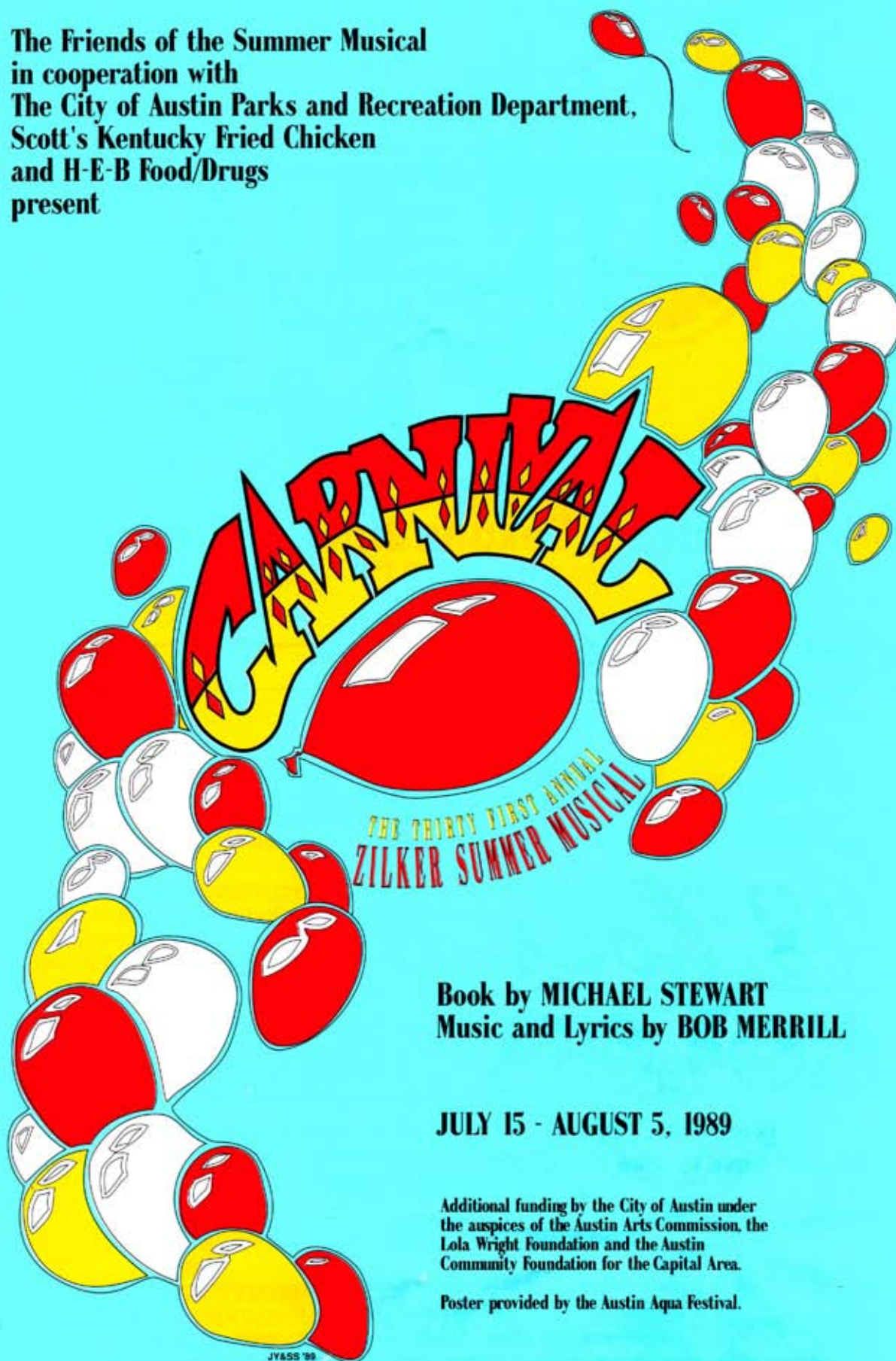

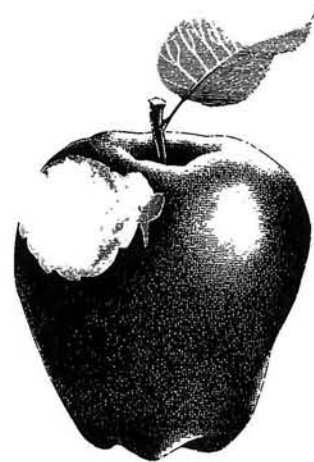

PRODUCTION STAFF



BIL PFUDERER. As supervisor of Performing Arts for the City of Austin, Bil has produced the Zilker Summer Musical for the past nine seasons. *CARNIVAL* will mark his tenth Summer Musical and his second appearance as an actor on the Zilker stage. He has played the part of Paul Berthalet the puppeteer in two other productions of *CARNIVAL*, one of which was directed by composer Bob Merrill. Bil's long and varied career in theatre spans over 35 years and encompasses design, directing and acting. As an actor he has worked both On and Off-Broadway, in regional and international theatre, in radio, T.V. and film. Bil has served as associate director at Live Oak Theatre where this season he directed *ALL THE WAY HOME* and *ANYTHING GOES*. He also serves as a member of The Board of Governors of Texas Non-Profit Theatres, Inc.

JUDY THOMPSON-PRICE. One of the most decorated and experienced choreographers in Austin, Judy has received eight Austin Circle of Theatre awards for her innovative dances in productions such as *GOOD NEWS!*, *GUYS & DOLLS*, *MISS LIBERTY* and *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN*. In addition to the 1988 Zilker Theatre production of *CAMELOT* as well as recent productions of *WESTSIDE STORY* at Southwestern University and *ANYTHING GOES* at Live Oak Theatre. In addition to teaching at her studio, The Dance Center, Judy is head of the dance department at Southwestern University.



JIM WEISMAN. This is Jim's third year to design scenery for the Zilker Theatre, having designed *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN* and *CAMELOT*. Jim designs for many venues around Austin including Capitol City Playhouse, Zachary Scott Theatre Center, and U.T. Opera Department. He received the ACOT award for set design for two consecutive years for *TORCHSONG TRILOGY*, *A CHRISTMAS CAROL*, *MORNING'S AT SEVEN*, *CAMELOT*, and *ARSENIC AND OLD LACE*. Jim is scene shop supervisor for The University of Texas Performing Arts Center.



MICHAEL B. RAIFORD. Michael is employed as a teaching assistant at The University of Texas and pursuing a M.F.A. in theatrical design. Originally from Florida, he received his B.A. in theatre from the University of South Florida. In Austin, Michael has designed costumes for *THE BOYFRIEND* at Capitol City Playhouse as well as premier productions of *THE BOOR* and *THE DOCTOR'S HOUSE* for U.T. Opera. This is Michael's first year with the Summer Musical.



NOEL ALFORD. Noel has been a composer, arranger, performing pianist and musical director of many Austin productions over the last 15 years, including *THE BAKER'S WIFE*, *THREE-PENNY OPERA* and *ZORBA* for Center Stage, *A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC* and *110° IN THE SHADE* at Zachary Scott Theatre, *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN* and *CAMELOT* at the Zilker Hillside Theatre, and most recently *ANYTHING GOES* at Live Oak Theatre. He has performed with popular cabaret singer Barbara Amaral for a number of years, and has written and produced a number of children's musicals.



LAURA S. OLDEN. Laura received her M.F.A. in lighting design from The University of Texas and is a free lance lighting designer. Her lighting design credits include *THE FOREIGNER*, *AMERICAN WINDOW*, and Live Oak Theatre's *J.B.* Her latest credits include Ballet Austin's *SNOW WHITE*, *RIGOLETO* at Capitol City Playhouse, Austin Shakespeare Festival's *MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING* and *LOVE'S LABOURS LOST*. Laura was nominated for an ACOT award in lighting design for last year's musical *CAMELOT*.



JIM FRITZLER. Jim is currently artistic director of Big State Productions and works in the Austin theatre scene as director, designer, actor and composer. He is serving as assistant musical director of the Zilker Summer Musical for the third year. He has composed extensively for theatre and dance and played for many dance companies nationwide including the Alvin Ailey School and Hartford Ballet. Jim has also taught theatre at St. Edward's University and Southwestern University.



PRODUCTION STAFF

BARRY COLVIN. Barry returns to the Zilker Hillside as Assistant Director in CARNIVAL after appearing as Sir Dinaden in last year's production of CAMELOT. A graduate of Northeast Louisiana University, Barry holds a B.A. degree in speech education. His Austin credits include THE SOUND OF MUSIC, GODSPELL and PIPPIN (for which he received an ACOT nomination). He has performed in productions of HELLO, DOLLY, THE LION IN WINTER, and Tennessee Williams' THE TWO CHARACTER PLAY.



AMANDA PARKER. This is Amanda's third appearance working on the production staff for a Zilker Hillside Theatre Summer Musical. She recently finished serving as stage manager for Austin Shakespeare Festival's production of LOVE'S LABOURS LOST. She has been active in a variety of technical positions in Austin theater for over four years including a number of shows at Zachary Scott Theatre and Capitol City Playhouse. Amanda will surely miss the Zilker Summer Musicals when she moves to Maine this fall.



LOUIS RIGLER. Louis came to Austin from New York City in 1972 after seven years as a stage manager, lighting designer and performer in the northeast. His work here has been seen on most local stages and in film and video projects including two years as designer/stage manager for the Paramount Theatre. Recent work includes a performance art piece called YOU KNOW WHAT IS RIGHT, a role in FATHER'S DAY at Hyde Park Theatre, light designs for dancer Jimmy Turner and production stage manager for three of this season's shows at Live Oak Theatre. CARNIVAL marks Louis' first association with a Zilker Summer Musical.

JOHN YORK. This is John's fifth year to work on a Zilker Summer Musical. He recently finished a season with the Alley Theatre in Houston as their scene shop foreman. A graduate of The University of Texas department of drama, John has worked in technical theatre not only in Texas, but at scenic studios in New York and New Jersey. He plans to return to the New York area this fall.

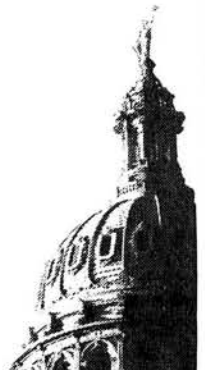

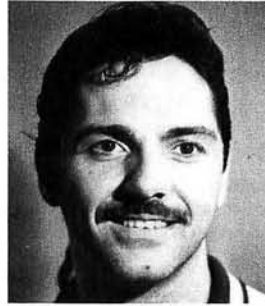

PHYLLIS E. McANELLY (*Lili Daurier*). A native Austinite, Phyllis graduated from Stephen F. Austin High School and The University of Texas where she received a degree in nursing. She is currently pursuing a masters degree in health administration from Southwest Texas State University and is employed as a marketing systems specialist for Austin-based Healthcare International. Her stage credits include the roles of Mrs. Paroo in *MUSIC MAN* and Lili in

CARNIVAL. While at U.T. Phyllis was an active member of the Longhorn Singers and appeared in the Zilker Hillside production of *THE MOST HAPPY FELLA*.



JOE YORK (*Marco the Magnificent*). *CARNIVAL* will mark Joe's sixth time in a Zilker Summer Musical. He appeared as Johnny Brown in *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN*, and performed in *CAMELOT* as Lancelot. Joe has played a wide variety of characters in over thirty plays and musicals in Austin, and recently directed the musical *IS THERE LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL?* at Hyde Park Theatre. He is employed with the Special Events section of the City of Austin

Parks and Recreation Department. Joe designed the poster and program cover logo for *CARNIVAL*, and designed and built the puppets for tonight's show.



CHRIS JENNINGS (*Jacquot*). Chris' theatrical credits include roles in Austin as well as in productions on the east coast from Miami to New York. After graduating from the University of Miami, he returned to Texas. He has appeared in *NOISES OFF* at Capitol City Playhouse and in Austin Shakespeare Festival's *MUCHADO ABOUT NOTHING*. Most recently, he was seen as Billy in Live Oak Theatre's *ANYTHING GOES*. Other performances include *LITTLE SHOP OF*

HORRORS, *BRIGHTON BEACH MEMOIRS* and *CHICAGO*.



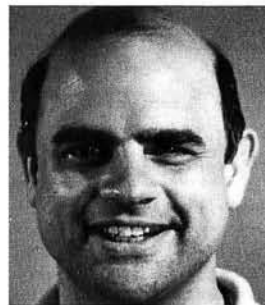

the spokesman for the Austin-Travis County Humane Society and is familiar to the area television audience for his public service announcements on behalf of the Society.

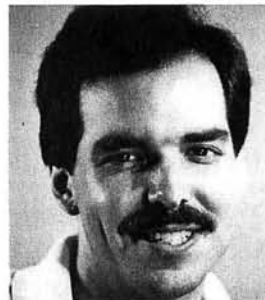

In addition to his performance as Horace Miller in the 1986 production of *MISS LIBERTY*, he has played various roles in *GUYS & DOLLS*, *THE UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN*, *THE MOST HAPPY FELLA*, *HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS WITHOUT REALLY TRYING*, and last year was Sir Sagamore in *CAMELOT*. 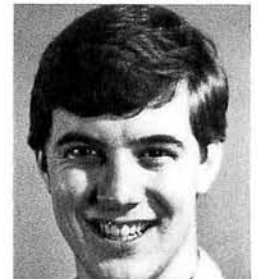

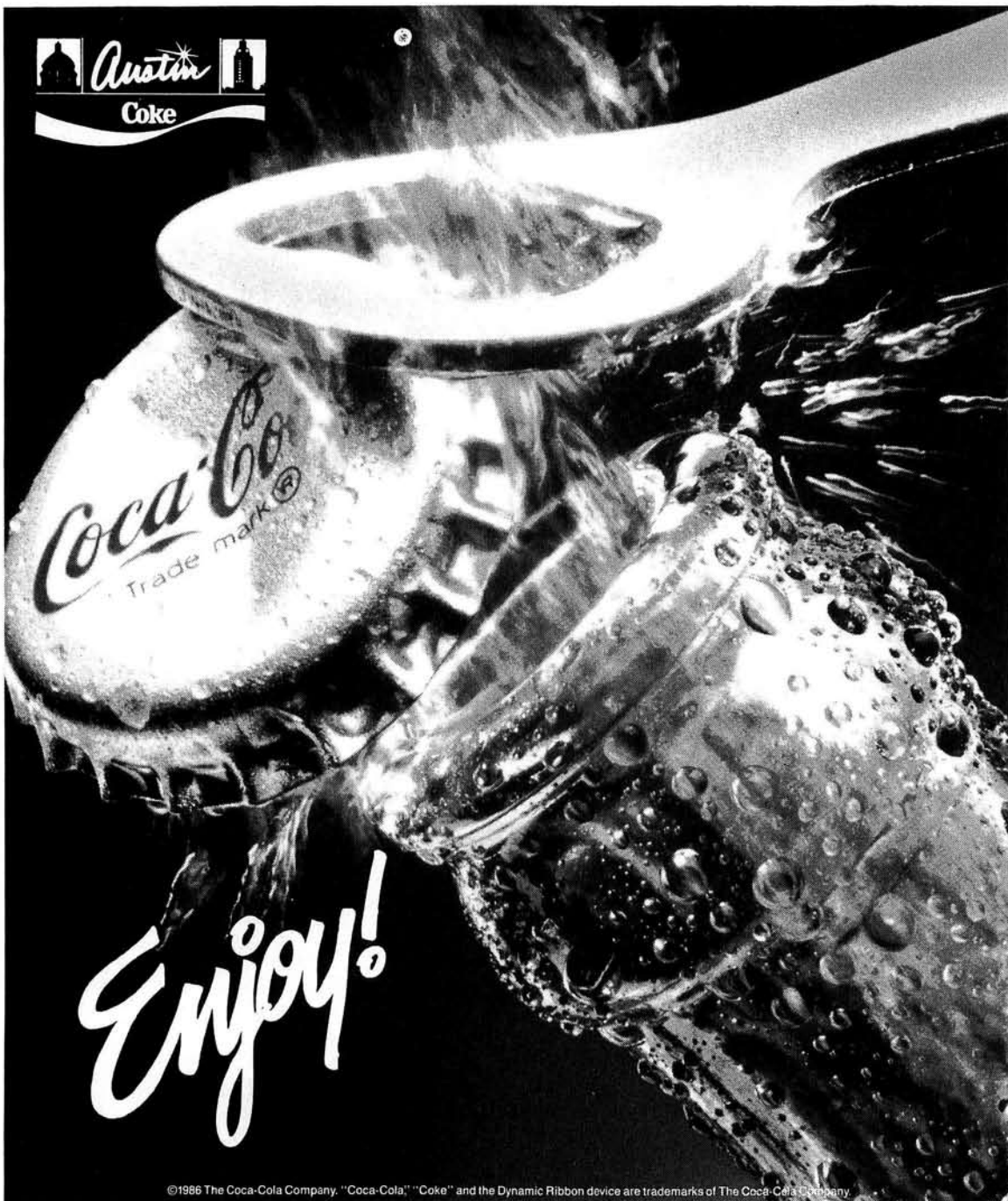
