But one day hard times fell upon the land, and the treasury ran low. The leaders of the kingdom decided they could no longer afford to pay for the festival and keep it running.





THE STORY



NCE UPON A TIME... a witch sent a baker into the woods on a quest for a slipper as pure as gold, a cow as white as milk, a cape as red as blood, and hair as yellow as corn. If he could bring all four items back in three days, the witch would reverse the curse on his house so that he and his wife might have a child. Armed only with magic beans, he goes on the quest.

At the same time a young lad, Jack, travels through the woods to find the marketplace to sell his beloved cow. Cinderella goes to the festival and runs through the woods — away from a perfectly charming prince. The witch visits the woods to see Rapunzel whom she has imprisoned in a tower. When the baker arrives at Granny's house, he recognizes the wolf in Granny's clothing, and cuts open the wolf's stomach to release Little red and Granny. As a reward, Little Red gives the baker her red cape (I Know Things Now). Then baker trades some magic beans for Jack's cow, Milky-White. (I Guess This Is Goodbye and Maybe They're Really Magic). As the first day ends, characters present morals to their fairy tales (First Midnight).

On the second day, Cinderella's prince meets his brother in the woods. The younger prince has fallen hopelessly in love with Rapunzel (Agony). The baker's wife overhears that Rapunzel's hair is as yellow as corn, so she yanks a lock. When she meets the baker—they have three of the four objects for the witch's potion. After they realize that It Takes Two, Milky-White keels over and dies. The Second Midnight is gone.

After his second journey up the beanstalk, Jack returns with a hen that lays golden eggs. He brags to Little Red Riding Hood about the harp that plays beautiful music by itself. She dares him to get it.

Meanwhile, Cinderella doesn't know what to do with the prince who pursues her (On The Steps Of The Palace). Again she meets the wife who offers her last magic bean; Cinderella thoughtlessly casts the bean away. She swaps her one golden slipper for the wife's shoes so that she can run faster away from the prince.

The baker returns with an imposter cow to replace Milky-White; the witch discovers the deceit, and restores the real Milky-White to life. Now the baker has all the objects; the witch tells him to feed them to the cow and milk it to make her potion. The potion doesn't work. When the witch discovers that the hair was Rapunzel's, she cautions the baker that she is forbidden to touch any of the objects. A mysterious man comes up with a solution — feed the silky hair of the ear of corn to the cow. Then the witch reveals the true identity of the mysterious man. He is the baker's run-away father. Suddenly, the potion works. The witch transforms into a beautiful woman! But the mysterious man dies.

As the tale resolves, the baker's wife is pregnant, Cinderella marries the prince, the witch (though beautiful) loses her magic powers. Rapunzel's tears cure her prince's vision, but Cinderella's cruel stepsisters, Florinda and Lucinda, are punished by Cinderella's birds — they pluck the girls' eyes out and blind them. At the conclusion of Act I, everyone thinks they'll live happily *Ever After* but we see a new beanstalk growing in the background!

S ACT II OPENS, everyone who thought they would be **So Happy** finds they are rather bored. Then, the foot falls of yet another giant causes earthquake tremors throughout the kingdom. The villagers flee for their very lives — back into the woods. The Princes confess to one another that they have fallen in love with two new impossible dreams: a Sleeping Beauty in a glass casket and Snow White surrounded by dwarves (**Agony Reprise**).

The baker, his wife and Little Red join up in the woods to confront the giantess. Jack's mom verbally assaults the tall woman but the Steward silences her with a fatal blow. The witch offers the narrator to the giantess, who rejects him by dropping him to his death. Next, Rapunzel, in a hysterical moment, runs in the giantess' path and is squashed (Witch's Lament). As the baker's wife looks for Jack in the woods, she meets and falls for the prince (Any Moment). He loves her and leaves her (Moments In The Woods). The wife is left to face the giantess alone.

In another part of the forest, Cinderella finds her mother's grave destroyed, and the baker consoles her. They join forces with Jack and Little Red but soon find that they are blaming one another for their troubles (**Your Fault**). The witch becomes furious and leaves the little group to their own devices (**Last Midnight**). The baker abandons his baby to the care of Cinderella, but is haunted by his father, the mysterious man. Deciding to return to the group, the baker helps to devise a plan to trap the giantess. He and Jack go off to hide in a tree-top and club the creature, while Cinderella consoles Little Red about the death of Granny (**No One Is Alone**). With the aid of Cinderella's birds, they kill the giantess. All the characters in the show then return with their morals of the fairy tales. The baker begins to tell the tale we have just seen to his child. And the witch advises us to be careful because **Children Will Listen**.

Before moving to Austin, Sandy performed in Phoenix, Denver and summer stock, where she played roles from Lady Bracknell to PETER PAN, and appeared as Sarah in the premier production of QUILTERS at the Denver Center Theatre Company. Sandy has also appeared in such movies as BALLAD OF THE SAD CAFE, and has done national and regional TV commercials and radio spots. But the Coup de Whatever was her marriage to John, her husband of thirty-five years, and undoubtedly, her very best friend.






