His past performances include Oklahoma!, Into the Woods, West Side Story, Little Me, Guys and Dolls, and Will Rogers Follies. Kirk recently appeared in NAP's hit musical, Personals, which made for his 75th show in Austin. Kirk has won four B. Iden Payne Awards, including three for Best Actor in a Musical, and one for Best Supporting Actor in a Musical. Currently, Kirk is Vice President of an environmental consulting firm, and appreciates the support of his friends, family, co-workers and partner for letting himself be stretched so thin! Enjoy the show, help keep this wonderful Austin tradition on the hillside and give generously.

Laura Avery – (Mitzi Miller) Laura is excited to make her Zilker Summer Musical debut in *Crazy For You*. She's got a love for Gershwin and all of the dancing that comes along with this musical. She's enjoyed watching Zilker Summer Musicals from the hillside for many years and is thrilled to participate from the other side of the stage this time. Ms. Avery comes to Zilker with a background in ballet, jazz and tap dancing. In fact she's been dancing with Judy Thompson-Price's Dance Center for 13 years. Laura graduated from the University of Texas and is currently employed as a mechanical engineer.

Kelly Bales – (Irene Roth) While Kelly has performed in seven productions with Austin Musical Theatre – most recently as Ado Annie in AMT's Celebrate! and Doris Macafee in Bye Bye Birdie – this will be her Zilker Hillside debut. Kelly is also an original member of AMT's Junior and Senior Companies and has received an All-State Soloist award. She graduated from Stephen F. Austin High School in June and is off to Webster University in St. Louis this August to pursue a BFA in Musical Theatre.

Espy Biehle – (Patricia Fodor/Marcelle Early) This is Espy's fifth Zilker Summer Musical. Others include Guys and Dolls, South Pacific, Big River and Will Rogers Follies. Past productions include Gypsy, Fiddler on the Roof, Jesus Christ Superstar, Music Man, Man of La Mancha, Celebrate! with Austin Musical Theatre, Steadfast Tin Soldier, Snoopy!, and Yankee Doodle with Second Youth, She has also performed in Evita and Hairwith Zachary Scott Theatre, and Damn Yankees with Austin Playhouse.

Treavor Bogard - (Harry C. Fields) Crazy For You marks Treavor's first appearance on the hillside, and ends his three-year hiatus from the stage. Previously, Treavor worked as a theatre, speech, and English teacher in Andrews, Texas, where he directed student productions and UIL One Act Play events. While attending McMurry University in Abilene, Texas, he appeared in several stage productions including Lettice and Lovage, The Seven Year Itch, XSR/DIE!, The Grapes of Wrath, and Galileo. Presently, he works as a training specialist for TxDOT, and is a graduate student at the University of Texas. Treavor is glad to lend his West Texas twang to this production.

Rochelle Relova Bush – (Elaine Lorraine) After recently moving to Austin from Chicago, Rochelle decided to audition for *Crazy For You* and happily, got a part! Rochelle is quite proud to be part of this, her first Zilker Summer Musical with all of these remarkably talented people. She's performed in several musicals such as The Who's *Tommy, A Chorus Line, The Wiz, Hair,* and *Little Shop of Horrors*. She would like to thank her extraordinary husband, Austin, and her wonderful family for their love and support throughout the years. Most of all, she would like to thank God for His love and blessings.

Joy Farmer-Clary – (Tess-Zangler's Favorite) Joy has been living in Austin for just over six months now, and absolutely

loves it. This is Joy's second time to play Tess in Crazy For You, and her third Austin show, after performing Celia in As You Like It and Ensemble in Fame. She has performed all over the country in such roles as Sophie in the Star Spangled Girl, Lina Lamont in Singin' In The Rain, Annie in The Real Thing, Hellene in Sweet Charity, and Mary in the two person adaptation of The Secret Garden. She has a BFA in Theatre from Ole Miss, where she graduated with honors.

Tommie Crutcher - (Sam B. Williams) Tommie is a senior at the McCallum High Fine Arts Academy, where he is involved in Choir, Dance, Color Guard, Film Society, Ballet Folklorico, Jazz Choir, and Mu Alpha Chi. He's a four-year member of the Broadway Texas Junior Company, and has appeared in such shows as Oliver!, My Fair Lady, Charlie Brown, and Bye Bye Birdie. Tommie has also been in Fame, The Music Man and Annie, and is making his Zilker Summer Musical debut. Additionally, he has enjoyed being a part of Austin Children's Choir, Believe in Me, and Celebrate! With Austin Musical Theatre. Tommie is the 1st lieutenant of the Greater Mt. Zion Drill Team.

Christina Dahlberg – (Mother - Mrs. Lottie Child/Justine Johanson) With a whopping fifteen Zilker Summer Musicals under her belt, and soon to be Mrs. Dillard Gilmore, Christina is excited to make Crazy For You her sweet sixteenth. Past Zilker Summer Musicals include, Big River, Once Upon A Mattress, Oklahoma!, Annie, Camelot, Miss Liberty, and Good News!. Other favorite roles include those in Gift of the Magi – also directed by Mr. Schroeder and her part as Sister Mary Amnesia in Nunsense.

Allison Doyle – (Vera Ann Pennington) Allison is excited to be making her Zilker Summer Musical debut in *Crazy For You*. She began her training in San Antonio with Myra Worthen. You may recognize



her from previous roles in productions of My Fair Lady or Celebrate! with Austin Musical Theatre. Other performance credits include Annie Get Your Gun, as well as numerous roles in Texas Ballet Concerto's The Nutcracker. She is a senior Finance major at UT Austin.

Rona Ebert – (Ina Clarey) Rona Ebert was a member of Austin Civic Ballet – now Ballet Austin – for seven years and later toured with professional tap company – Austin on Tap for five years. She has also danced with Tapestry Dance Company and later performed in Austin Musical Theatre productions of Peter Pan, West Side Story, Jesus Christ Superstar, The Music Man and Celebrate! She is now very old and lucky to be able to still walk a straight line in her first performance on the Zilker hillside stage.

Kasey Erin Eggleston – (Sheila Gray) Kasey is a native to Austin, Texas, and began her training at Austin Ballet Theatre and Austin Dance Academy with Arletta Howard-Logan, Randy Soileau, and Greg Easley. She later trained with Stephen Mills and Michelle Martin at Ballet Austin and in the summer of 2000, she had an opportunity to study in London. Kasey has danced a variety of roles in different ballets including, The Nutcracker, Peter and the Wolf, Swan Lake, and Sleeping Beauty. Kasey has also danced in many different musicals including Oklahoma!, Sweet Charity and My Fair Lady with Austin Musical Theatre, and Smokey Joe's Café with Zach Scott Theatre. This is Kasey's first performance with Zilker Theatre Productions.

Jeanette Franz – (Darlene Dunne) Jeanette should be a familiar face to musical theatre-goers here in Austin. Neal Gibson - (Bela Zangler/Custus Fowl) Having appeared on almost every other stage in Austin, Neal is thrilled to finally be making his debut on the Zilker Hillside stage. He has received numerous B. Iden Payne Award nominations for his work as an Actor, Music Director, and Choreographer, taking home the trophies for: Is There Life After High School? and Godspell (Featured Actor - Musical); Hair and Simply Sondheim (Music Director); and; The Musical Comedy Murders of 1940 (Featured Actor - Comedy). 

While at TWU, she performed with their International Folk Dance Company in Atlanta, New Orleans, Biloxi and all over the State of Texas. Her Senior Choreography project was presented at the Southwestern Region American College Dance Festival. She has studied ballet, tap, jazz and modern dance for twenty years and enjoys teaching dance as well. When not dancing, she can be found patrolling the shores of Lake Travis with her dogs Romeo and Hamish.

Valdo Perales – (Eddie Cantos/Perkins) Valdo has danced in several dance companies including Austin Ballet Theatre, Sharir Dance Company, Tapestry, and Stillpoint Dance Theatre. While he has worked with Austin Musical Theatre, this is his debut season with Zilker Theatre Productions. Past performance credits include, Peter Pan, West Side Story, Jesus Christ Superstar and Oklahoma!, with Austin Musical Theatre. With two years under his belt at St. Edward's University, James is looking forward to his third year as a theatre major. He was last seen on the St. Edward's stage in *The Kentucky Cycle*, look for him there this fall in *A Flea In Her Ear*. When he looks back on all he's done, he'd like to give a special thanks to his Mom, Dad, Tracie and Max.

Danny Servetnick – (Everett Baker) Danny, having given up his stage name of Daniel Pierce, made his Austin debut as Joseph in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dream Coat. After studying voice at the Philadelphia College of the Performing Arts, Danny left for three years to perform at Opryland U.S.A. Some of Danny's stage credits include Bob Cratchit in A Christmas Carol and Louis in West Side Story. TV and Film credits include Celebrity, License to Kill, Courage Under Fire, and Dallas. Additionally you might have heard Danny on your radio advertising for Beall's, Pepsi and Dodge trucks.

Marita Stryker - (Polly Baker) Marita is thrilled to be back on the hillside with her friends. She's a junior musical theatre major at Oklahoma City University where she has appeared in West Side Story, Oklahoma!, Bye Bye Birdie, and the world premiere of Night of the Comets. She has also performed in nine Austin Musical Theatre productions including Oliver, and Jesus Christ Superstar. She also received an Austin Critic's Table Award for her performance as "Peron's Mistress" in Evita at Zach Scott. Marita spent last summer singing with a big band at Busch Gardens and is very happy to be home in Austin singing some of her favorite Gershwin songs.

Zach Thompson – (Lank Hawkins) Zach is returning once again to the Zilker stage for another ZTP production. Since moving to Austin, Mr. Thompson has performed in various theatre productions, including Will Roger's Follies, and The Odd Couple. Zach got

to "toot his own horn" as Goodman King in his most recent role in Fame, put up by Silver Star Theatre Productions. Some of Zach's other credits include Curly in Oklahoma!, George in Our Town, and one of his favorites, Paul in Barefoot in the Park. The Austin theatre experience has been wonderful for Zach, and he looks forward to any and all chances to entertain! When not on stage, Zach works as an engineer.

Larissa Wolcott – (Margie "Lollipops" Bayes) This is Larissa's third Zilker Summer Musical and another in a long line of Austin performances. As Mary Jane Wilkes in Big River, she won the 2000 Critics Table Award for Best Supporting Actress in a Musical. Some of her other performances include The Rocky Horror Show, Evita, Rockin' Xmas Party, and Hair at Zachary Scott Theatre. She does voice overs for Japanimation, and received the 2002 B. Iden Payne Best Supporting Actress award, for Sally in, You're A Good Man Charlie Brown. Larissa made her film debut this year as Kevin Spacey's babysitter in the Alan Parker film, The Life of David Gale.

Aubrey Vale Word – (Patsy) Aubrey has appeared in seven previous Zilker Theatre Productions summer musicals including Once Upon A Mattress, Guys and Dolls, and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. She has also appeared in nine Austin Musical Theatre productions including Sweet Charity, West Side Story, Gypsy, and Oklahoma!. Having performed eighteen previous shows with T. Michael Word, this will be her first as his wife. Michael proposed to her on this very stage and she's thrilled to be back at Zilker, to dance with her husband and her "hillside" family.

T. Michael Word – (Billy Rogers) The Summer Musical has always been very special for Michael. This is the place of his theatrical debut in 1985 and Crazy For You makes number eleven. Previous Zilker Summer Musical appearances include, Camelot, Carnival, Guys and Dolls, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, and Once Upon A Mattress. Michael has also performed in twelve Austin Musical

Theatre productions, including West Side Story, Gypsy, Oliver, Oklahoma!, and Best Little Whorehouse in Texas. But the most memorable moment was when he proposed to his dance partner Aubrey, on this stage in 2000.

Leah Worrel - (Billye Burkowitz) Leah graduated from Ole Miss in May 2001 and moved to Austin the following August to work toward her Ph.D. in Chemical Engineering at UT. During high school, she studied vocal performance privately at the university of Southern Mississippi and continued at Ole Miss during college. Back home, she's appeared in such productions as Bye Bye Birdie, Once Upon A Mattress and Jesus Christ Superstar. In the summer of 1996, Leah performed in a production of The Wiz at the international Fringe Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland. This is Leah's first Zilker Summer Musical.

Jason Yau - (Mingo Rain) This is Jason's third Zilker Summer Musical, as he has appeared as Joe Harper in Big River, and a Jet in West Side Story. This native Texan has performed in various regional theatres from Austin to Houston. Select stage credits include Hair and Evita at Zachary Scott Theatre, Bandana with UT Graduate Opera Theatre, and Dirty Money at Vortex Repertory. Other favorite musicals include Guys and Dolls, Wizard of Oz, Grease, Oklahoma!, and Beauty and the Beast. Jason holds a BA in Music, with a vocal performance concentration, and a Minor in Business, from the University of Texas.





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# Production Team Bios

Scott Schroeder (ZTP Artistic Director/ Director/ Props Design)

Most known for his onstage work, Scott has performed in And The World Goes Round and Jelly's Last Jam, The Rocky Horror Show (Dr. Scott), The Who's Tommy (Uncle Ernie) and Schoolhouse Rock - Live! at Zachary Scott. Other local credits include: Anything Goes!, Bad Habits, Barber of Seville, Cabaret (Emcee), Candide, Sweet Bird of Youth, Sweeney Todd, Madame Butterfly, Man of La Mancha (Sancho/Padre), The Miser (Master Jacque), Music Man (Marcelius Washburn), Passion (Colonel Ricci) and Peter Pan (Smee). Scott has always had a fondness for the Zilker Park Stage since he started performing here in How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying back in 1983. A few of his other Zilker credits include Big River (King), Once Upon a Mattress (King Sextimus), Little Me (Benny Buchsbaum), Into the Woods, Camelot, Good News! and The Unsinkable Molly Brown. Offstage, his credits include everything from pit orchestra to sound/lights/prop/ set design to director, choreographer and producer for his own company Broadway Austin. As Artistic Director of Broadway Austin, he produced successful runs of Nunsense, Little Shop of Horrors and Gifts of the Magi which he also directed. He's also designed sound for several shows including Petra's Sueño, Fruits & Vegetables, Madame X and Cripple of Inishmaan and most recently, sound and foley for As You Like It directed by Ann Ciccolella at Zachary Scott. He has won numerous local nominations and awards for his acting as well as a B. Iden Payne Award for Properties Design for Little Shop of Horrors at Hyde Park Theatre. He also received a B. Iden Payne nomination for Director of last year's You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown for which he also designed set and props.

#### Mary Alice Carnes (Assistant Director)

Mary Alice is happy to return to the Zilker hillside after playing Jack's Mother last year in *Into the Woods*. She is honored to be working with Scott Schroeder on Crazy For You. They worked together on Teatro Vivo's Petra's Sueño by Ruperto Reyes, Jr., and she's excited to work with Scott on another fun production. Mary Alice directed Roosters by Milcha Sanchez-Scott and My Visits with MGM (My Grandmother Marta) by Edit Villarreal, both for Different Stages. Judy Thompson-Price (Choreographer)

Crazy For You will be Judy's sixteenth Zilker Summer Musical. She choreographed her first Zilker musical, Fiorello, in 1981. Her last work on the Hillside was Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, in 1995. She has received numerous ACoT Awards for her work that includes West Side Story, Grease, Good News!, Miss Liberty, The Most Happy Fella and many others. She has choreographed over 200 musicals, shows and ballets. Judy was guest choreographer for The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, at the Players Guild in Canton, Ohio in 1999. As a performer, Judy danced at Six Flags Over Texas and The Hemisphere in San Antonio. She danced for 16 years at the Austin Ballet Theatre, where she performed such roles as the ugly stepsister in Cinderella, the nurse in Romeo and Juliet and the wicked fairy, in Sleeping Beauty. She currently owns the Dance Center, where she teaches ballet, tap and jazz. She also teaches dance at Southwestern University. She is very excited to be back on the Zilker Hillside.

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
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

Balie and Beverly Griffith have been involved with over 15 summer musicals, providing both financial support and leadership to continue and maintain its heritage. Likewise, Lloyd and Arlene Storm were involved in many capacities, on over 15 summer musicals. Before Arlene's death, they were nightly mainstays as volunteers at the Zilker concession stand. 
